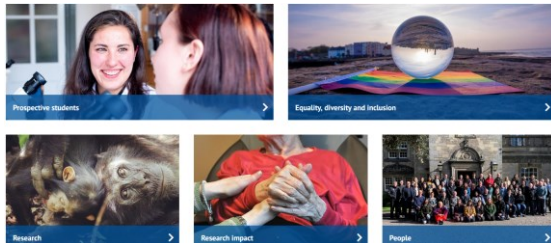
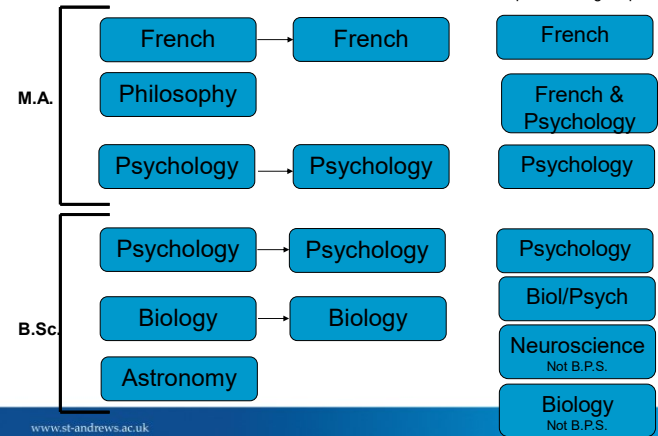

## Indicative Assessments in Psychology and Neuroscience

- Many modules balance coursework and examination  
e.g. First and Second year 40% coursework and 60% examination
- Honours modules vary depending on the most appropriate format  
e.g. Science engagement writing, research proposals, essays, technical reports, user guides, oral presentations etc.,

## Structure of Course

Junior Honours (Psychology and Joint Degrees ~150 students, B.Sc. Neuroscience ~40 students):

- Lectures
- Seminars
- Small group projects

Senior Honours:

- Lectures & seminars: choice of subjects
- Individual empirical supervised projects
- Independent review essay

## Structure of Course

- 1<sup>st</sup> Year (~ 350 students):
  - Lecture courses (4 days a week)
  - Practical/methodology classes
  - Two other (non-psychology) academic disciplines
- 2<sup>nd</sup> Year (~ 200 students):
  - Lectures
  - Practicals
  - Tutorials
  - One other (non-psychology) academic discipline



- Study Abroad opportunities (third year)
- Joint degree programmes with BPS are available for almost all subjects dependent on Honours module choices
- Research participation in on-going projects to experience high quality research in action (and get paid) through Internships.
